E4 DTP Funding details 2024

Fully-funded studentships - 3.5 years min.

- Stipend at UKRI standard rate 3.5 years minimum (2023/2024: £18,622 annual)
- Fees (for 4 years Home and International fees)
- Research Costs (minimum £3,450)
- Options to extend stipend to up to 5 further months (via PIP and PDS)
- Expectation to submit thesis by the end of the funding (although the maximum submission date will be 4 years from the programme start)

CASE studentships

Additional Research Costs to support the project.



International Fees Covered

The University of Edinburgh will cover the difference between the home fees (paid by E4) and the international fees. International students will not be expected to find alternative funding sources to cover this gap.

UKRI Eligibility Criteria

- All applicants, regardless of their nationality and country of residence, are eligible to apply.
- All appointees, regardless of their nationality and country of residence, will receive a fully-funded studentship.

Cap on international students number

E4 can recruit a maximum of 7 international students per year.



UoE fees status categories

- Home fees:
 - UK nationals, EU students with UK pre-settled status or settled status, non-EU students who have indefinite leave to remain, some Irish nationals
 - AND who comply with the 3-year UK/EEA residency immediately before the start of the degree (UK or Ireland residency for Irish nationals)
- International fees: all other categories

Exceptions: refugees, children of UK nationals, legitimate absence from the UK for UK nationals

Academic Eligibility Criteria

- minimum of 2.1 undergraduate degree or equivalent
- Relevant work experience and/or a Masters degree will be considered
- A Masters degree is not a requirement for application to an E4 studentship



English language Requirements

For non-native English speakers

- Degree taught and assessed in English:
 - UG or PG
 - No older than 3.5 years at programme start
 - taught and assessed in English in a majority English speaking country (see list)
- English Language Tests
 - IELTS Academic, TOEFL-iBT, CAE, CPE, Trinity ISE (see minimum marks required on web)
 - No older than 2 or 3.5 years

Supervisor-led Projects

- About 100 projects advertised
- Spanning a wide range of research areas within NERC-remit

- Once project identified, contact the main supervisor to show interest and discuss your application

Student-led Projects

- Find a supervisor willing to act as first supervisor
- Deadline to submit student-led projects: 15 December

Apply to 1 project maximum overall

- Applicants who would like to disclose information about belonging to one of our under-represented groups: declared disability, ethnic minority background, first generation to attend university, caring responsibilities, received/qualified for additional financial aid during your studies or other
- Widening Participation Form
- Optional
- Confidential (not seen by supervisors or selection panels) Widening Participation Panel

Disclosing special circumstances to the supervisors/selection panel

if you wish to disclose information to the supervisors/selection panels in order for them to take it into consideration when assessing your application, please do so via the application form instead.

Compulsory Documents (for all candidates)

- the E4 Application form
- the **Equality and Diversity Form**
- an Academic CV
- all Higher Education Transcripts and certificates of UG and PG degrees obtained to date

Optional documents (depending on circumstances)

- the WideningParticipation Form
- a valid English Language
 Test
- a proof of yourImmigration status

Prepare Application

- Compulsory documents
- Optional documents depending on circumstances

Follow our application step-by-step guidance on our website.

Contact Referees

- Send the E4 reference form to 2 referees
- Referees must upload their reference form via their referee portal by the application deadline

Submit application

- Upload your application material on our application portal by the application deadline
- Applications not including the compulsory documents by the deadline will be automatically rejected





E4 DTP Online Applicant Portal

The submission of your application material, including references, is via an online Applicant Portal.


Creating your Applicant Portal:

- 1. Click on "Apply for this project" at the bottom of the project proposal
- 2. Register with your name and email (or log in with Ease if UoE)
- 3. Check your email inbox for a link to your portal
- 4. Upload your documents when ready and by the deadline
- 5. Input your referees' information They will be emailed automatically with a link to submit their reference form.
- 6. There is no "submit" button, what you upload is what we see.

Use your Applicant portal (same link) to:

- Check that your references have been submitted.
- Replace any document already submitted (if necessary).
- Change your referees information (if necessary).
- Check any messages from the E4 admission team

WRITTEN APPLICATIONS EVALUATION

Supervisors selection

Applications are reviewed by the projects' supervisors who select their preferred candidates.

E4 Shortlisting panels

The selected applications are shortlisted by three thematic E4 panels.

INTERVIEWS

The top 60-70 applicants* are invited for interview and their performance evaluated by E4 panels.

OFFERS

Application and interview evaluations are combined to constitute the final ranking of applicants. The top ~25 applicants* are offered a studentship.

E4 Widening Participation Panel

May recommend additional applications for consideration

* Proportionally to the NERC cap for international students



E4 DTP Recruitment Timeline 2023/24

15 December 2023	Student-led Projects Submission Deadline
4 January 2024, noon	Application Deadline
15 February 2024	Outcome sent via email by
27, 28 and 29 February 2024	Interviews
4 March 2024	First Offers sent by
20 March 2024	2024 Universal NERC DTP acceptance of offers date (before which candidates are not obliged to accept any NERC-funded PhD offer)





E4 DTP Application - Tips

Plan Ahead

- Contact the main supervisor of the project you apply for before preparing your application.
- Contact your referees as early as possible in the process.
- Start gathering documents and completing the application forms ahead of the submission deadline.
- Create your applicant portal and upload your documents well ahead of the deadline.




Make your application count

Use the CV and the application form to demonstrate the skills, experience and knowledge you will bring to the project:

- Scientific statement: explain why you chose to apply for this PhD programme and your scientific interest in your chosen project (max 300 words)
- Research experience: describe any research project or activities you have undertaken in the past and highlight the skills you gained (max 200 words)
- Professional/Other experience gained out with academia: describe professional experience or other experience and achievements which you think will be relevant to a PhD (max 200 words)
- List any publications (even under review)


